Literacy Ambitions Pay Off

From her arrival at our agency, Elva Corbaton, from Mexico, was an eager student of English, reliable and dutiful in doing her homework. Her tutor, Bob Lewis pronounced her an excellent, hard-working student. After several years, because of her desire to give back to the agency, Elva started volunteering for us in the office, shelving books in our library and working on chores on the computer.

So a year or so later, a staff person from Adriance Library called looking for a bilingual student who might be able to do outreach to the Latino community and teach a computer class in Spanish. We recommended Elva and put her in touch with the library. Several months later, Elva was hired for the job and now, through our collaboration with Adriance Library, Elva is being paid to teach computer classes in Spanish and to recruit students for our Monday night ESL classes which take place at Adriance. We regularly serve 20 to 30 students a night with volunteer English tutors teaching at five different levels. Elva is kind, approachable and helpful. She loves her job shepherding students to the appropriate level class and escorting parents with their children to our free babysitting service. Her computer classes on Tuesday and Wednesday nights are always full, and there is always a smile on Elva's face.

Summer Slide

The "summer slide" isn't a fun new piece of playground equipment. It's how educators refer to the academic loss that children experience when they don't read

over the summer. Well, the children at the Community Family Development Center won't have to worry about that slide given the amazing job they did reading this summer.

The twenty-five children in the school-age room at CFD Center, ages 6-12 years old, were challenged by the Center's Board of Directors to read at least 10 books each. If they reached their goal, the children would get to choose their reward. CFD center partnered with Literacy Connections' Classroom Book Buddies, a program funded by United Way to encourage children to keep up their reading and explore a variety of books. Volunteers from Classroom Book Buddies read with the children weekly in July and August, bringing 30-40 books each visit.

With the help of their teachers and volunteers at

Classroom Book Buddies, the children just didn't meet their goal—they blew it away! To help the children stay motivated, the teachers had them write the title of each book they read on a colorful slip of paper and post it on their reading wall. By the end of the summer, these twenty-five children had read 376 books! Their reading wall went from floor to ceiling. They truly earned their reward—a trip to play Laser Tag.

In addition to a great time playing Laser Tag, the children received a reward that is even more valuable. Thanks to the CFD Center Board, caring teachers, and dedicated Classroom Buddies volunteers, these children will start the new school year off even more successfully. Book Buddies Questions Answered

A United Way Funded Program



What is it? Book Buddies is a program that gives adult volunteers the opportunity to read one-on-one with elementary school children on a weekly basis, right in the school.

Who do we serve? We help children in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade selected by their teacher for extra reading practice.

Where are we? Arlington, Beacon, Poughkeepsie, Wappingers, and Hyde Park Schools and looking to expand to additional Dutchess County and Newburgh schools

How long have we been around? Two years

How are we doing? For the 2012-2013 school year, 100% of the teachers wanted to continue to have Book Buddies for their students and 97% of students in the program improved both reading skills and reading confidence.

Who are our volunteers? Our volunteers are working and retired adults, college students, at-home parents, and seniors.

What is the commitment? One hour per week from October through May

Why do we do this? It is critical for children to read at grade level by 3rd grade since it is the time when they are transitioning from *learning to read* to *reading to learn*.
